The business of the Closed Session having been completed, Mayor Boddy adjourned the Closed Session at 6:41 p.m. Council moved to the Regular Council meeting at 7:02 p.m. All Council and staff members listed above were present.

Mayor Boddy acknowledged with respect the history, spirituality, and culture of the Anishinaabe Peoples whose traditional territories we gather on, and whose ancestors signed Treaties 82, 45 1/2, and 72 with our ancestors. Mayor Boddy also recognized the Great Lakes Metis whose ancestors shared this land and these waters.

Mayor Boddy acknowledged the recent discovery of unmarked graves at several former residential schools and asked that everyone stand to observe a moment of silence.

Mayor Boddy advised that after serving as the City's top Firefighter for the past six years, Fire Chief Doug Barfoot has announced his retirement. Mayor Boddy noted that Chief Barfoot has been with the Owen Sound Fire Department since 1983 as a Firefighter, working his way up the ranks to Fire Chief in 2015. Mayor Boddy advised that the City will miss Chief Barfoot's commitment, leadership, and wealth of knowledge that he has demonstrated, and thanked him for his years of service to the people of Owen Sound.

The Fire Chief left the meeting at this time.

8. PUBLIC MEETINGS

There were no public meetings.

9. DEPUTATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

9.a Deputation from Gordon Price Re: Owen Sound Billy Bishop Regional Airport Gordon Price provided a deputation on the Owen Sound Billy Bishop Regional Airport.

Mr. Price noted that the City has indicated that the imposition of landing fees will bring in an additional \$100,000 a year in revenue, adding that it is his opinion that the City will lose \$100,000 a year due to the landing fees.

Mr. Price advised that under the previous landing fee structure, the City would have collected approximately \$900 in landing fees in April 2021, while under the new structure, it has only collected \$485 due to the reduction of landing fees for commercial aircrafts.

Mr. Price noted that as a result of the new landing fees, two hangar residents have left for other airports, one aircraft was sold, five hangars are for sale, private aircraft movements are down, economic development has stopped, and pilots are refusing to land at the airport which leads to a reduction in fuel sales.

Mr. Price reviewed the condition of the airport as it currently stands, noting that there are cracks in the runway, runway markings have faded, the airport kitchen has not been cleaned and is in a state of disrepair, and the water system is in need of repair.

Mr. Price highlighted the possible future of the airport should the landing fees stay, citing the potential lawsuits from hangar owners over the execution of a lease in bad faith and potential claims for damages on the potential reduction of resale value of hangars due to the landing fees.

Mr. Price provided several recommendations for the airport including removing landing fees, increasing commercial landing fees to \$225, reducing new hangar lease rates to \$0.45 per square foot, installing 24 hour self-serve fuel pumps, reducing the price of 100 low lead fuel and increasing the price of jet fuel, determining the true value of the airport through an economic impact study, opening a restaurant, funding a runway maintenance program, and changing the name of the airport to 'The Grey Bruce Regional Airport.'

Council advised that the \$35 landing fee is a user fee similar to paid parking, adding that those who benefit from the service should be paying for it rather than the general taxpayers of the City of Owen Sound.

9.b Deputation from Dave Aston, MHBC Planning Re: Official Plan Update - Final Official Plan

The Manager of Planning and Heritage introduced Dave Aston and Liam Murphy of MHBC Planning who provided a deputation to Council on the City's final Official Plan.

Mr. Aston advised that the purpose of the Official Plan Update is to ensure consistency with Provincial Policy, conformity with applicable planning policies such as the Grey County Official Plan and Niagara Escarpment Plan, implement

recommendations from other adopted master plans and studies, and address changes to the community and potential future community demographics.

Mr. Aston advised that the City is in the final stages of the City's Official Plan Update, and provided an overview of the steps taken in updating the Official Plan, including the consultation process, discussion papers, visioning session, all of which lead to the final Official Plan document.

Mr. Aston advised that the new policies will establish a long-term and forward-looking Official Plan and develop a new Climate Change section and policy direction. The new Official Plan also contains updates on policy language, with a focus on equity, diversity, and inclusion; new policies for housing, attainable housing, and additional dwelling units; consolidated River District policies; modifies the policy framework for retail and commercial policy review; updates policy language for waste management and waste reduction items; strengthens policies that promote active transit infrastructure and connectivity to trails and parks; and provides policies and support to become increasingly connected via high-speed internet.

Mr. Aston advised that the Official Plan contains schedules for land uses that have been updated based on current information respecting land use, transportation, trails, and bicycle routes. These updates provide for a clearer land use schedule, and a land use schedule that can be used in a more effective way through G.I.S. systems in the future.

Mr. Aston requested that City Council approve the minutes of the Community Services Committee meeting held on June 16, 2021, and in so doing, adopt the updated Official Plan.

When will the City of Owen Sound act to protect the historic County of Grey Registry Office at 1240 4th Ave East?

The City Clerk advised that the City's By-law Enforcement Division has received a complaint and is working with the property owner to address the matter. Due to the property being vacant, the work has not been deemed essential during the COVID-19 lockdowns, which has created delays.

Ms. Bloomfield added that she has been informed that the property owner has been in contact with City Planning staff regarding eligibility for the City's new Community Improvement Plan (CIP) programs. Staff will continue to encourage the property owner to apply to a CIP program and will provide assistance as needed.

Mayor Boddy noted that several questions were received of a similar nature and due to the large number of agenda items to be addressed, requested that the Clerk only read the questions and not the pre-ambles. No member of Council challenged the Mayor on this direction.

10.b Cody Hawes, Owen Sound Resident, asked the following question:

In section 43 under the subsection of Reconciliation, The Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action calls upon all levels of government to implement the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples as the framework for reconciliation. Please explain how your decision to proceed with the Canada Day celebration is aligned with this framework.

10.c Anne-Marie Hay, Owen Sound Resident, asked the following question:

Will you reconsider cancelling the Canada Day celebrations in order to honour the missing and murdered Indigenous children?

10.d Callum Batten, Kitchener Resident, asked the following question:

How is the act of celebrating Canada Day, and within so doing, celebrating the country and government that created and ran residential schools, at a time of deep grief and mourning for many Indigenous peoples across Owen Sound and beyond the city upholding "meaningful and important step(s) in truth and reconciliation"?

10.e Jay Rideout and Hayley Moody, Owen Sound Residents, asked the following question:

How are you able to justify continuing with this year's celebrations even after continuous calls to cancel from so many Indigenous Nations?

12.f Verbal Report from the Deputy Mayor Re: Grey County Council and Grey Bruce Board of Health

Deputy Mayor O'Leary advised that County Council received a report on the feasibility of the Wiarton International Airport, as the Township of Georgian Bluffs no longer believes that the annual \$350,000 deficit is sustainable. The staff report came with a recommendation to provide a 50 percent contribution toward the operating deficit of the airport, to a maximum of \$175,000 per year. Deputy Mayor O'Leary advised that he spoke against the recommendation due to the City of Owen Sound having its own airport deficit. The motion was later amended to remove the financial contribution, and to direct staff to work collaboratively with Georgian Bluffs, South Bruce Peninsula, and the County of Bruce to issue an expression of interest for a public-private partnership at the airport.

Deputy Mayor O'Leary advised that the Grey Bruce Health Unit has administered 144,677 COVID-19 vaccines to date in Grey and Bruce Counties, with 13,465 doses having been administered in the past seven days.

Deputy Mayor O'Leary added that the Grey Bruce Health Unit continues to provide core functions and services throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, including the needle exchange program, enhanced outreach, response to overdoses, naloxone distribution, and regular opioid working group meetings.

Deputy Mayor O'Leary advised that Grey-Bruce has seen a decline in new cases of COVID-19 connected to the recent surge. The origins of the surge can be traced to specific sectors of the community, with the Delta variant driving the surge. Deputy Mayor O'Leary added that COVID-19 continues to be a threat to unvaccinated adults, especially middle-aged and older adults. The Grey Bruce

Health Unit is taking a multi-pronged approach to addressing the surge, recognizing that the majority of cases are situationally complex, and are related to disadvantaged groups within our society.

The Grey Bruce Health Unit recognizes that the Delta variant is more contagious than other COVID-19 variants and is working to get all Grey-Bruce residents vaccinated with their first or second dose by the end of July.

Deputy Mayor O'Leary noted that to heal and move forward, everyone must do their part to educate themselves as individuals, parents, and educators.

17.b Canada Day and Residential Schools, and Vandalism of Pride Crosswalk

Councillor Tamming advised that his preference is to cancel Canada Day Celebrations, but with the decision on Canada Day celebrations already having been made, he withdrew his item on Canada Day and Residential Schools.

Councillor Tamming read an open letter to the individual(s) who vandalized the recently installed Pride crosswalk. Councillor Tamming noted that the Pride crosswalk was deliberately placed in its location as it leads to what a former Mayor has called the 'Civic Livingroom' of Owen Sound. The crosswalk was installed as a symbol to make everyone in Owen Sound feel welcome and included. Councillor Tamming added that despite the vandalism, the bands of colour will stay.

17.c AMO Course Event Update

Councillor Merton advised that she recently attended a training session offered by the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) pertaining to Human Rights and Equity. The training provided an important and innovative discussion on matters that are important to Council and the Community, including the intersection of Human Rights and Equity, understanding what Equity is, the impact of decision-making frameworks and data, creating change in Equity in a municipality by confronting biases, roles and opportunities in working towards Equity, and working towards making new choices.
