1. Call to Order

The chair called the meeting to order at 10:08 a.m.

"Prior to today's meeting the Board met in closed session to review and discuss matters that in their opinion fell under Section 35 (4) of the Police Services Act, R.S.O 1990 c. P.15 and as per the Owen Sound Police Services Board BY-LAW NO. 2019-01 Section 19.1 Closed Items."

Chair Thomson reported that a presentation was received from the newly appointed Inspector General, Devon Clunis, Ontario's first Inspector General of Policing, and Deputy Inspector General Ken Weatherill, and Dr Michelle Lloyd Executive Data Officer. They presented on their new roles with respect to policing in Ontario, and the partnership they wish to develop with police services across the province.

8. Chairman’s Report

Chair Thomson reported that on September 14, Zone 5 of the OACP held their quarterly meeting via Zoom. Chair Thomson, Chief Ambrose, G. Pierce and J. Tamming were in attendance for this Zoom meeting.

During the OACP meeting Jeff McGuire, Executive Direction of the OACP gave an update on the Community and Safety Policing Act (CSPA) and the work that is being done to build regulations to support the new act. He also spoke of work they are doing to develop a consistent vaccination policy among the Ontario Police Associations.

Duane Sprague, OSPS representative from the Ministry also gave a brief presentation and expects the new CSPA to come into effect April 1, 2022. With respect to training, this is also in the development stages and more information should be forthcoming.

Lisa MacDonald, our OAPSB Zone director gave an update on proceeding at the association.

Member Tamming inquired as to why we are hiring more special constables, when the courts have been basically closed for 18 months and current special constables are being reassigned.

Inspector Bishop noted that all of the special constables at the courthouse are part time, and the vast majority of them have second jobs making their availability limited, and others have left. The courts remain open and staffed for security at a lower level due to attendance and we need to maintain our contingent of part timers to staff the required hours.

Our new Financial Coordinator had just been hired and there was a steep learning curve to bring her up to date on all the facets of the monthly financial statements. Also, the invoicing for dispatch contracts were not up to date as they could be due to the transition. As a result, revenue numbers are down and any numbers provided would be subject to change. Chief Ambrose has discussed this issue with Kate Allen Director of Corporate Services at the city and she is not concerned with expenses as they appear to be in line and with invoicing now sent out, revenue should increase to budgeted levels.

Owen Sound Police Service (OSPS)

For many of the newcomers, especially refugees, policing is a “make or break” factor in their ability to feel welcomed and safe in a new country. Police corruption is a sad reality, in many developing countries. Many of the people interviewed described situations over and over about the absolute necessity to pay bribes in order to function in their countries of birth. Furthermore, torture or even murder, by the police, is not uncommon, according to many people we interviewed. The unfortunate consequence, of that, for many newcomers is fear of the police. For example, one refugee described a situation where she needed to go to the police station to get a police check for a job in a retirement home. She was so afraid that she went to the front door of the Owen Sound Police Station four times before she got the courage to go in.

Clearly, we haven’t interviewed every single newcomer who ended up in Owen Sound or Grey/Bruce but for the ones we did interview, praise for the police, was a common theme. Given the initial fear of the police by many newcomers, an intentional strategy was developed by Owen Sound Police Department in collaboration with one of the sponsors. What unfolded is an example of proactive, community policing that could be a model in communities who are finding themselves “home” for people from the developing world. This is what happened, as told by the sponsor:

Binyam (pseudonym) arrived in Owen Sound almost two years ago and he and his wife saved every penny so they could afford a down payment on their own house. Their sponsors told them about government programs to make it a little easier, such as first-time buyer incentives and reduced work history requirements for refugees. They were excited to buy their first home – a starter home- that turned out to be in an area of Owen Sound that experienced a high rate of crime. This became a frightening experience. They became aware of drug dealing and prostitution in the alley behind their house. Sometimes they could hear obscenities and fights on their block. Binyam was very worried about his wife and children especially when he was away at work. He told them not to venture outside, even during the day. When they told their sponsor – now past sponsorship stage but still a close friend- the obvious advice was to call the police.

Calling the police was not something Binyam would even remotely consider. Would the police send him and his family back to their country of origin? Would they demand bribes? Would their neighbours find out and see them as trouble makers? Would there be retaliation? Given their life experiences these are reasonable questions.

The sponsor contacted Chief Ambrose and Inspector Fluney and they discussed the need for an intentional and compassionate strategy. This happened right after the Black Lives Matter March in Owen Sound and the senior officers were determined to show the minority community, they were safe here and that the police were allies. A connection was made with Constable Jason Cranny, the Community Services Officer, and he recommended a gradual relationship building intervention. Step one was dinner at the sponsor’s home with Binyam, his family and Constable Cranny – in street clothes. He brought gifts for the children and played with them. Step two was a visit to their home with his

summer students. Simultaneously, an increased police presence was established on the block, and especially in the alley. The family began to feel safe. Soon, Constable Cranny became a friend and visits regularly.

In another instance, Constable Cranny was asked to help a teenage boy who experienced severe trauma before arriving in Canada. Once again, a friendship was established. This young man was encouraged to join the Junior Optimist Club, where he made new friends and helped with various community projects. Eventually, he was hired by the Police Service to work as a summer student. This young man now has a career goal of becoming a Police Officer.

Word spreads quickly among the newcomer community and these experiences are shared creating a wider circle of trust and engagement.


What is harm reduction?

- Harm Reduction seeks to reduce the health and social harms associated with addiction and substance use, without necessarily requiring people who use substances to abstain or stop. The harm reduction approach to substance use is evidence-based, and includes programs, services and practices.
- Essential to harm reduction is that it provides people who use substances a choice of how they will minimize harms through non-judgmental and non-coercive strategies that enhance skills and knowledge to live safer and healthier lives ([CMHA Ontario](#)).








Harm Reduction Services at Grey Bruce Health Unit

THE NEEDLE SYRINGE PROGRAM (NSP)

- Safe drug use equipment and disposal of used needles
- Containers to safely dispose of drug use equipment
- Overdose prevention and naloxone training
- Referrals to testing and treatment for sexual transmitted and bloodborne infections
- Referrals to other health and social services
- Recruitment of new NSP sites
- Liaison with [15 contracted NSP sites](#) to ensure efficient functioning
- [Educational materials](#) on safe disposal of found needles - see sharps disposal

NSP is confidential and is offered at the Grey Bruce Health Unit (GBHU) Mon-Fri, 8:30 am to 4 pm, no appointment needed. The NSP is also offered at the 15 additional partner sites.

THE NALOXONE PROGRAM

- Training employees of eligible organizations to dispense naloxone to their clients
- Recruitment of new naloxone distribution sites
- Consult with contracted naloxone dispensing organizations to ensure efficient functioning
- Training and supplying Police and Fire Services with naloxone for use as first responders
- Overdose prevention and naloxone training for other interested community organizations

HARM REDUCTION OUTREACH

- GBHU staff offer NSP services in several communities lacking harm reduction services
- Outreach is offered at food banks and in response to community overdose surges
- Provide public and stakeholder education about the harm reduction philosophy

OPIOID WORKING GROUP

- The GBHU provides leadership for the Opioid Working Group (OWG) subgroup of the Grey Bruce Community Drug and Alcohol Strategy, bringing together professionals and community members to address the opioid epidemic locally, as outlined in the [Grey Bruce Opioid Response Plan](#).

BE ABLE TO RECOGNIZE AND RESPOND TO OPIOID OVERDOSE. GET A NALOXONE KIT.

Naloxone is free, no prescription required at pharmacies and the Grey Bruce Health Unit.

KEEP PRESCRIPTION OPIOIDS SECURE AND MONITOR THE AMOUNT.

If you have a prescription for opioids, keep your medication locked and/or monitor the amount. If medication is missing, someone may be taking it. Return unused or expired medications to the pharmacy for safe disposal.

LEARN HOW TO LOWER OVERDOSE RISK.

- Avoid using alone. Have a friend who is not using stay with you.
- If using alone, call the National Overdose Response Service at 1-888-688- 6677. Someone will stay on the line and call 911 if you do not respond.
- Get Naloxone and have it ready. Naloxone is at pharmacies and the Health Unit.
- Use 1 drug at a time. Avoid mixing. Mixing drugs, including alcohol, increases overdose risk. If mixing, use less of each drug.
- Start with a small test dose and go slow. If you have had a break from using, use less.
- Learn how to recognize an overdose. When in doubt, give Naloxone.
- Plan a safe ride home.
- Call 911 and give Naloxone if you witness or experience an overdose. The Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act protects the caller and anyone on the scene from simple drug possession charges.

PROTECT PEOPLE FROM DISCRIMINATION BY RECOGNIZING STIGMATIZING BEHAVIOUR.

Stigma can have a significant impact on the quality of life of people who use drugs, people who are in recovery, and their loved ones. Take some time to "check yourself" and reflect on your own personal biases when communicating about substance use.
