2021 Highlights

We started 2021 with the Province of Ontario issuing a stay-at-home order in response to the pandemic, but allowing libraries to offer curbside services. We reopened to the public in March and then the Province issued an emergency brake in April and we were back to offering curbside services. Their roadmap to reopening in June allowed us to begin to add back services, but it wasn't until September that we saw a real reset. During the year, we improved the air purification and circulation within the building. We supported the public by assisting with the printing and laminating of over 3,000 vaccination receipts.

In response to the pandemic, we continued to offer most of our programming online, often using Zoom. One programming highlight was the launch of Poet Laureate Richard-Yves Sitoski's legacy project, No Sleep 'Til Eden, which utilized augmented reality to incorporate multimedia embedded in the book of poetry. Other programming highlights included our virtual OSMiCon, the summer reading program, seven author visits, the me and white supremacy book club, our storytime live sessions, the cozy kids and caregivers book club, the book club with a twist, our sketch circles, the Scientists in Schools program and our adult poetry contest.

In 2021, we added more e-resources including LinkedIn Learning (formerly Lynda.com) for our patrons to be able to access anywhere 24 hours a day, every day. We launched a new OSNGUPL app for smart phones and tablets. The app helps library patrons to sign out materials, manage their account, access eBooks and eAudio through Libby, access Mango Languages, PressReader and LinkedIn Learning and access our social media.

2021 Highlights - 2

Another highlight was the transition to our new online catalog which is designed for enhanced user engagement and satisfaction. We also began work on the redesign of our library website.

We were pleased to improve not only our online collection, but our physical collection as well. In 2021, we loaned Chromebooks and Amazon Fire tablets, book bundles, Ontario Parks passes Grey Sauble Conservation Authority passes, radon detector kits, board games, jigsaw puzzles and poetry packs. We created take and make kits and storytime to go kits.

Internally we upgraded our telephone system, rebranded email system, enhanced our online banking and accounting systems and redesigned and refreshed our library newsletter process. We began discussions and development of our new "Open Card" which will be launched on May 18th, 2022.



Special thanks to all staff for the hard work, willingness to take on new challenges and commitment to delivering exemplary customer service. We have a talented and dedicated team at the Library. We would like to thank Chris Carmichael, Carolin Brooks, Laura Stirling, Debbie Davidson and Stephanie Welsford for their many contributions to the library. Best wishes on your future endeavors. We welcome Dale Albrecht, Jodi Burton-Scheifley and Suzanne Majzik to our team.

In December, all three municipal partners approved a new Union Library Agreement for 2022 through 2031. "Union" is a specific designation in the Ontario Libraries Act which means that the library is formed through the active co-operation of more than one municipality. Serving the municipalities of Chatsworth, Georgian Bluffs and Owen Sound, our library is the largest "union" library in Ontario by service area and population. For over 25 years, we have been fortunate to be able to demonstrate the commitment of our local municipalities to work together to ensure library services for their citizens. It truly is a highlight of 2021 to have this continue with the completion of a new ten-year agreement.

Lastly, we would like to thank you for supporting local library service as a patron. We strive to provide quality twenty-first century services to you.
