1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Farrell called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m.

4.a Minutes of the Accessibility Advisory Committee meeting held on July 25, 2023.

8. **REPORTS OF CITY STAFF**

8.a Verbal Report from Chair Farrell Re: Future of the Accessibility Advisory Committee

Chair Farrell gave an overview of the staff report that went to Council recommending some changes to the committee structure and the recommendation to dissolve the Accessibility Advisory Committee at the end of this committee term. The legislative requirement from the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act* (AODA) is that the City have an Accessibility Advisory Committee, which would still be met by joining the Grey County Joint Accessibility Advisory Committee, which meets four to six times per year.

Responding to a question from the Committee, the Deputy Clerk advised that if Council decides to dissolve the Accessibility Advisory Committee and join Grey County, they would have to make a resolution at Council to opt-in to the Grey County Committee and send that resolution along with a letter to Grey County stating they are opting-in. Then Grey County would update their terms of reference to include the City of Owen Sound.

Responding to a question from Committee, the Deputy Clerk advised that in consultation with the Grey County Clerk and Accessibility Coordinator, if the City were to opt-in, they would not add another public member to the Committee. The City would have to provide their rationale with a Council resolution to Grey County Council requesting an additional member that resided in Owen Sound. The Deputy Clerk noted that designating a member to live in a specific area differs from the County's current committee structure and could risk treating the City differently regarding residency stipulations.

Committee members discussed support for recommending that Council ask that Grey County consider adding an additional member who resides in Owen Sound to be added to the Joint Accessibility Advisory Committee.

Responding to a question from Committee, the Deputy Clerk advised that the Grey County Committee application process is similar to the City's, wherein they would put out a call for application notice, and community members would apply directly to Council. Applications would be reviewed, and members appointed.

Responding to questions from Committee regarding the Multi-Year Accessibility Plan, assessment tool for site plan approvals, and Human Resources and Inclusion Strategies, the Deputy Clerk advised that these would still be reviewed with staff internally, the public, City Manager or Council, and would be taken to the Grey County Joint Accessibility Advisory Committee for comment and approval, as applicable.

Responding to a question from Committee, the Deputy Clerk commented that the City encourages the present committee members to apply to other committee vacancies.

Committee members discussed the accomplishments of the City's Accessibility Advisory Committee, concerns over moving the committee to Grey County, the loss of having individuals who have self-identified with a disability on City committees, considerations to provide to Council, and the accessibility issues in the City that have not been addressed.

- 2. Allow for evaluation of the Accessibility Advisory Committee during that time, including but not limited to structure, process, and effective use of committee and staff time."

12.a Chair Farrell Re: Weaver's Creek Boardwalk

Chair Farrell discussed rebuilding the boardwalk on the trail at Weaver's Creek in Harrison Park and the recommendation provided to Council by staff to reconstruct and create a more accessible trail with the help of volunteers and community donations.

Committee members discussed their support for this recommendation and ensuring Accessibility Standards are met. The Deputy Clerk advised that the option approved by Council was to start with an open call for community groups and skilled volunteers to support the project, and then a plan would be formed. As this is a redeveloped public space, the plan will have to come to Committee for review and comment.
