Notable Certifications Achieved, Specialty Courses/ Training:

In 2024, we continue to focus on several Technical Rescue disciplines, including Ice & Water Rescue, Marine Navigation & Open Water Rescue, Technical High Angle Rope Rescue, and Confined Space Rescue. Thanks to the support from Georgian College, a Confined Space training trailer was provided, and all members took part in training with it. Having this training trailer was an excellent opportunity for the firefighter to re-fresh skills while working in a safe training environment.

All members completed re-certification on First and CPR to a level of BLS/HCP for Fire Fighters.

Josh Nicholson, Brian Bridges and Jason Redmond were given the opportunity to attend the 2024 Canadian Highrise Conference in Barrie. This training event was one day of training packed with several hands-on practical skill stations, including

Notable Activities:

We have already conducted 41 public education sessions in 2024, with over 1100 people attending.

We are delighted to continue the Jr. Fire Fighter Program, in which forty kids in grades five and six participated for five nights in a program that included fire safety education, CPR, first aid, and other firefighting-related technical skills. We look forward to continuing this annual event.

Our office worked with Owen Sound Police and Grey County Housing due to two significant fires in our community. The fire at 248 7th Ave E was investigated, and FPI McEwen worked very closely with Grey County Housing officials to ensure that the occupants were housed. In light of the preventable fire in the apartment, we are looking into further educational opportunities.

Notable Projects: Refurbishment of an SL75 Ladder Truck partnered with Sutphen Fire Trucks out of Urbana, Ohio, to replace the current 2004 American Lafrance Aerial#4 75-foot ladder truck. The truck committee has been working hard to ensure that all mechanical, safety, and equipment alterations and legislated Canadian requirements are met to meet and exceed the safety of our firefighters and the community they serve.

Updated 4 Gas detection equipment has been implemented to replace the outdated gas detection equipment.

All equipment and apparatus are inspected and repaired based on an annual schedule that complies with government-regulated standards and mandates.

Annual Ministry of Transportation (MTO) (Yellow Sticker) Safety Inspections on Apparatus and Boat Trailers.

Annual Fire Pump Capacity Testing as per National Fire Protection Act (NFPA) 1911/1901 Standards.
