1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Boddy called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m. and noted that all Council members were present except Councillor Hamley.

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

3.a Councillor Farmer – Budget Process

Councillor Farmer declared a non-disqualifying interest with the budget process as his sister-in-law is the Director of Corporate Services and is responsible for the City's annual budget exercise and administers the City's finances on behalf of Council. Councillor Farmer advised that should an item that directly impacts the Director of Corporate Services be discussed he will need to declare an interest.

6. PUBLIC MEETINGS

6.a Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBA) No. 54 – 1750 16th Avenue East (Hotel Development)

Mayor Boddy declared the Public Meeting open at 5:34 p.m. and read the following announcement:

- Every person who attends a statutory public meeting required under the Planning Act will be given an opportunity to make representations respecting the proposed by-law.
- All submission materials for this application are available on the City's website and at the Planning Division counter at City Hall during regular business hours.
- Recent amendments to the *Planning Act* by the Province now limit appeal
 rights on a Zoning by-law amendment application to the applicant, public
 bodies, and specified persons who made oral or written submissions to
 Owen Sound City Council prior to a decision being made. Specified
 persons generally include energy, railway and telecommunication
 providers as well as NAV Canada.
- This meeting is an essential part of the decision-making process.
 Feedback received will be considered in the decision of the Owen Sound City Council. An explanation of how the public and agency comments factored into the decision will be included in the Notice of Passing of the By-law.
- Where a change is made in a proposed by-law after the holding of the
 public meeting, Council will determine whether any further notice is to be
 given respecting the proposed by-law and the determination of Council as
 to the giving of further notice is final and not subject to review in any court
 no matter the extent of the change made in the proposed by-law.

The City Clerk explained that notice of the Public Meeting was posted on the subject property, posted on the City's website, and circulated to the prescribed persons and bodies on January 7, 2025. All comments received prior to the agenda being published were attached to the agenda. The applicant registered to attend the meeting electronically. The City Clerk encouraged those present for the public meeting to sign the sign-in sheet located on the table outside of Council Chambers.

The City Clerk advised that personal information is collected under the authority of the *Planning Act*, and that the information collected will be used to complete the Zoning By-law Amendment processes and will form part of the public record. Questions about this collection should be addressed to the City Clerk.

The City Clerk advised that any person wishing to receive notice of the decision of The Corporation of the City of Owen Sound on the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment application must make a written request to the City of Owen Sound care of the City Clerk.

The Manager of Planning and Heritage provided a presentation on Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBA) No. 54 put forward by Ron Davidson on behalf of 16 Avenue OS Inc. Ms. Robart highlighted the location of the subject lands, noting that the lands are designated East City Commercial in the City's Official Plan. The lands are zoned as General Industrial in the City's Zoning By-law.

Ms. Robart advised that the purpose of the application is to permit the construction of a 120-room, six-storey hotel on the northern portion of the property. The existing buildings and uses on the southern portion of the property are to remain at this time. It is anticipated that the property will be subject to a future consent (severance) application. The effect of the application is to amend the current zone categories applying to the subject lands consistent with the East City Commercial designation of the City's Official Plan.

The special provisions for the northern portion (hotel) propose to establish sitespecific zoning regulations regarding building height, among other matters:

- The proposed building height is 19.8 m. The maximum building height permitted by the C2 zone provisions is 18 m. The building is proposed to be six (6) storeys in height.
- The Holding provisions on the southern portion will require the completion
 of a retail market analysis, in accordance with Section 3.5.2.5 of the
 Official Plan, to the satisfaction of the City of Owen Sound prior to the
 establishment of any future retail or commercial use that is less than 465
 square metres or greater than 1,400 square metres.

Ms. Robart advised that a complete application has been submitted and all application materials are available on the City's website. Ms. Robart highlighted the ZBA process to date and advised that a recommendation report and enacting by-law are tentatively scheduled to be presented to Council on February 24, 2025.

Ron Davidson, applicant, advised that Ibrahim Dossani, part-owner of the property and Ambika Gandi, project consultant were present virtually. Mr. Davidson provided an overview of amenities proposed within the hotel and noted associated job creation impacts. Mr. Davidson advised that a future severance will be sought to separate the north and south portions of the property, and that the building on the south side of property will eventually be removed and replaced with new commercial development. Mr. Davidson noted the positive aesthetic impact on 16th Avenue East and advised that the requested ZBA is aligned with the Official Plan.

Mayor Boddy invited members of the public to ask questions or provide comments on the proposed ZBA.

Hilary Coburn, Owen Sound resident asked if LEED certification had been considered to reduce the proposed building's carbon footprint, provided comments in agreement with those submitted by the Historic Saugeen Metis, and asked if consideration had been given to the outdoor space on the property.

There being no other comments, Mayor Boddy declared the Public Meeting closed at 5:49 p.m.

The Manager of Planning and Heritage left the meeting.

6.b 2025 Budget

The Mayor declared the Public Meeting open at 5:50 p.m.

The City Clerk explained that notice of the Public Meeting was published in The Sun Times newspaper and posted on the City's website on January 14, 2025. All comments received prior to the agenda being published were attached to the agenda. Two additional comments were received after the publication of the agenda and were circulated to Council in advance of the meeting. These comments will be added to the agenda when it is republished. No individuals registered to attend the meeting electronically. The City Clerk encouraged those present for the public meeting to sign the sign-in sheet located on the table outside of Council Chambers.

The City Clerk advised that personal information is collected under the authority of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, and that the information collected will be used to complete the budget process and will form part of the public record. Questions about this collection should be addressed to the City Clerk.

The Director of Corporate Services provided a presentation on the 2025 draft budget. Ms. Allan highlighted the draft levy increase which is estimated to be 2.44% or \$861,538. Ms. Allan provided a levy increase comparison to neighbouring and comparator municipalities, as well as a comparison to the operating budget and organizational chart of the Town of Cobourg. In closing, Ms. Allan provided an overview of next steps, including that a final budget report

will be brought forward to a Council meeting in February, with the budget by-law to follow at the subsequent Council meeting.

Mayor Boddy asked if there was anyone present to speak at the public meeting.

Sonya and Lucas Ostertag, Owen Sound residents, provided comments respecting the impacts of climate change and suggested Council commit funding and staffing to climate action.

Joachim Ostertag, Owen Sound resident, spoke on behalf of the Climate Action Team Owen Sound and provided comments respecting the need for a staff Climate Action Coordinator to implement the City's Climate Action Plan and Climate Adaptation Plan.

Hilary Coburn, Owen Sound resident, provided comments respecting climate action solutions and suggested Council consider sharing a staff person with the Township of Georgian Bluffs or creating a part-time role dedicated to environmental initiatives.

There being no other comments from the public, Mayor Boddy delayed the Public Meeting closed at 6:15 p.m.
