




Owen Sound Management Structure




Public Works and Engineering Organizational Structure

Council-Committee Relationship

Council:

Makes the final decision on all matters

Committees:

- Provide advice and recommendations to Council
- Host public meetings or open houses as directed by Council
- Monitor and evaluate financial and operational performance of programs and services

- 243 Lane km Road
- 107 km Sidewalk
- 4.2 km Forcemain Sewer
- 119.3 km Gravity Sewer
- 160.6 km Watermain
- 1668 Maintenance Holes
- 680 City-owned Fire Hydrants
- 61 Flushing points/blow-offs
- 2196 Mainline Water Valves

Locates Completed in 2023

- 2,099 water locates
- 320 street lighting locates
- 61 Traffic light locates
- 37 emergency locates



2024 Statistics

Special Events

- 27 Events supported in 2024
 - o 17 required road closures
 - 18 equipment requests
 - 14 required media releases on behalf of the event and road closure
 - o 3 also required a Grey County permit
 - o 20 are recurring (annual) events
 - 23 work orders generated; resources applied totalled \$25,689.68

Absorbed labour costs can vary widely depending on the scope of the road closure.

Most expensive 2024 event was November 16th (Christmas Parade, Holiday Magic, Hockey Fest, Northern Lights at over \$8,160.

Engineering Permits

- 165 permits issued from 201 applications
- 84 exempted from fees (events, utilities and utility contractors, COS and COS contractors, waived)
- 81 applications paid fees, totalling \$6,114 (up from \$3,983 in 2023 due to fee structure changes)
- 5 permits were extended. 5 were placed on hold, and 20 were abandoned after applying. 4 carry over to 2025.



2024 Statistics

Water Assets Added through Operational work

- 2 dead ends looped
- 185 water meters replaced
- 12 new water meter installs
- 12 hydrants installed/replaced/rebuilt
- 12 new water services for infill lots
- 10 water meters upgraded to radioread technology
